The **irisdata.txt** file contains measurements from 150 iris flowers. The measurements are the sepal length, sepal width, petal length and petal width. So you have M=4 features, N=150 observations. A principal component analysis (PCA) should be done on these data. How many percent of the total variation do the two first principal components explain?

The **irisdata.txt** file contains measurements from 150 iris flowers. The measurements are the sepal length, sepal width, petal length, and petal width. So you have M=4 features, N=150 observations. A principal component analysis (PCA) should be done on these data.

After the PCA, the flower data (sepal lengths and widths, petal lengths and widths) are projected into PCA space. What are the projected values of the first flower?

The photo called sky_gray.png is loaded and a linear histogram stretching is performed so the new image has a maximum pixel value of 200 and a minimum pixel value of 10. What is the average pixel value of the new image?

The photo called sky.png is loaded and an RGB threshold is performed with the limits R < 100, G > 85, G < 200, and B > 150. Pixels with values within these limits are set to foreground and the rest of the pixels are set to background.

The resulting 2D binary image is morphologically eroded using a disk-shaped structuring element with radius=5.

When doing an erosion the pixels beyond the image border are assigned a value of 1 (the default Matlab behavior).

The photo called flower.png is loaded and it is converted from the RGB color space to the HSV color space. Secondly, a threshold is performed on the HSV values with the limits H < 0.25, S > 0.8 and V > 0.8. Pixels with values within these limits are set to foreground and the rest of the pixels are set to background.

Finally, a morphological opening is performed on the binary image using a disk-shaped structuring element with radius=5. When doing a dilation, pixels beyond the image border are assigned a value of 0 and when doing an erosion the pixels beyond the image border are assigned a value of 1 (the default Matlab behavior). What is the number of foreground pixels in the resulting image?

An abdominal scan has been acquired on a CT scanner. One of the slices of the scan is stored as a DICOM file called 1-179.dcm. An expert has marked a part of the liver as a binary mask (region of interest). The binary mask is stored as the file LiverROI.png. By using the DICOM image and the mask image, the image values in the DICOM image inside the mask (the liver) can be extracted.

The average value and the standard deviation of the extracted pixel values are computed. A low threshold, T1, is defined as the average value minus the standard deviation and a high threshold, T2, is defined as the average value plus the standard deviation.

Finally, a segmentation of the DICOM image (1-179.dcm) is made where all pixels with values > T1 and < T2 are set to foreground and the rest are set to background. How many foreground pixels are there?

An abdominal scan has been acquired on a CT scanner. One of the slices of the scan is stored as a DICOM file called 1-179.dcm. A low threshold, T1 = 90, and a high threshold, T2 = 140, are defined. The pixel values of the DICOM image are segmented by setting all pixel values that are >T1 and <T2 to foreground and the rest are set to background.

The binary image is processed by first applying a morphological closing using a disk-shaped structuring element with radius=3 followed by a morphological openingwith the same structuring element. When doing a dilation, pixels beyond the image border are assigned a value of 0 and when doing an erosion the pixels beyond the image border are assigned a value of 1 (the default Matlab behavior).

In the final step, a BLOB analysis is done using 8-connectivity. The largest BLOB is found. The area (in pixels) of the largest BLOB is:


